### Non-Examples

- My friend is really loquacious.
- I like to use the word loquacious to impress my friends..

### Bad Examples

- The word loquacious means really talkative.
- If you are loquacious then you talk alot.

**If you write Non-Examples or Bad Examples, you will have to rewrite them over until you get them right.**

**After a while, you will no longer be able to rewrite non-examples or bad examples and will just lose credit for that work.**

### Tips for writing Good Context Sentences

- A context sentence includes the word and its meaning in the same sentence.
- One easy way to do this is to write 2-part sentences (often with a semi-colon or a colon).
- The first part introduces the word in a context.
- The second part defines the word.

### Examples of Good Context Sentences

- My friend is so loquacious that once she gets started talking you can hardly get her to shut up.
- The loquacious man dominated every conversation; he would not stop talking, but at least he was funny!
- The comedian is known for being loquacious; he is so talkative that he really has to practice to keep his act short enough.
